this book uses the psychological literature on rationality to weigh in on the recent debate between virtue epistemologists and epistemic situationists it argues that both sides have misconstrued the literature and that an interactionist framework is needed to square epistemic theory with empirical facts about reasoning and inference the explosion of empirical literature on human rationality has led to seismic shifts across a multitude of academic disciplines this book considers its implications for epistemology in particular it critically evaluates the treatment of the rationality literature within the recent controversy between virtue epistemologists who attempt to ground knowledge in stable epistemic virtues and epistemic situationists who claim that such a project is doomed by empirical evidence of widespread irrationality it links this foundational controversy to two of the most important debates in psychology the rationality wars and the person situation debate the book argues that both virtue theorists and epistemic situationists have misunderstood the implications of these debates leading them to focus exclusively on personal dispositions and situational factors as two independent sources of epistemic success failure and improvement a more accurate reading of the empirical literature implies that interactions between epistemic agents and their social informational and institutional environments are the fundamental drivers of both rational and irrational behaviour an interactionist framework motivated by this insight conceives of epistemic virtues and vices as both responsive to and responsible for the environments in which they re manifested and cultivated the central aim of this book is to present and defend this novel type of virtue epistemology rationality in context will be of interest to scholars and advanced students working in epistemology philosophy of science philosophy of psychology cognitive psychology and social psychology

this volume makes a philosophical contribution to the application of neuroscience in education it frames neuroscience research in novel ways around educational conceptualizing and practices while also taking a critical look at conceptual problems in neuroeducation and at the economic reasons driving the mind brain education movement it offers alternative approaches for situating neuroscience in educational research and practice including non reductionist models drawing from

dewey and phenomenological philosophers such as martin heidegger and merleau ponty the volume gathers together an international bevy of leading philosophers of education who are in a unique position to contribute conceptually rich and theoretically framed insight on these new developments the essays form an emerging dialogue to be used within philosophy of education as well as neuroeducation educational psychology teacher education and curriculum studies

this collection of 19 chapters all appearing in print here for the first time and written by an international team of established and emerging scholars explores the place of intellectual virtues and vices in a social world relevant virtues include open mindedness curiosity intellectual courage diligence in inquiry and the like relevant vices include dogmatism need for immediate certainty and gullibility and the like the chapters are divided into four key sections foundational issues individual virtues collective virtues and methods and measurements and the chapters explore the most salient questions in this areas of research including how are individual intellectual virtues and vices affected by their social contexts does being in touch with other open minded people make us more open minded conversely does connection to other dogmatic people make us more dogmatic can groups possess virtues and vices distinct from those of their members for instance could a group of dogmatic individuals operate in an open minded way despite the vices of its members each chapter receives commentary from two other authors in the volume and each original author then replies to these commentaries together the authors form part of a collective conversation about how we can know about what we know in so doing they not only theorize but enact social virtue epistemology

since the turn of the century the idea that intellectual capacity is fixed has been generally accepted but increasingly psychologists educators and others have come to challenge this premise outsmarting iq reveals how earlier discoveries about iq together with recent research show that intelligence is not genetically fixed intelligence can be taught david perkins renowned for his research on thinking learning and education identifies three distinct kinds of intelligence the fixed neurological intelligence linked to iq tests the specialized knowledge and experience that

individuals acquire over time and reflective intelligence the ability to become aware of one's mental habits and transcend limited patterns of thinking although all of these forms of intelligence function simultaneously it is reflective intelligence perkins shows that affords the best opportunity to amplify human intellect this is the kind of intelligence that helps us to make wise personal decisions solve challenging technical problems find creative ideas and learn complex topics in mathematics the sciences management and other areas it is the kind of intelligence most needed in an increasingly competitive and complicated world using his own pathbreaking research at harvard and a rich array of other sources perkins paints a compelling picture of the skills and attitudes underlying learnable intelligence he identifies typical pitfalls in multiple perspectives and neglecting evidence he reveals the underlying mechanisms of intelligent behavior and he explores new frontiers in the development of intelligence in education business and other settings this book will be of interest to people who have a personal or professional stake in increasing their intellectual skills to those who look toward better education and a more thoughtful society and not least to those who follow today's heated debates about the nature of intelligence

the spanish society of experimental psychology sepex was born from an agreement of 16 pioneering researchers from different spanish universities gathered in the university of almería on july 1st 1997 for its foundation in that first meeting the first statutes of sepex were drafted and the first board of directors was elected whose composition partially changes every 2 years the objectives of the society are to promote the development of scientific knowledge in all fields of psychology promote research and the dissemination of its results among researchers and promote the relationship with national and international homologous societies and organizations organize and promote scientific meetings periodically inform members of the society about activities related to experimental psychology from its foundations in 1997 sepex has grown to more than 400 members and has become the referent in the field for the exchange of scientific research in spain from the first sepex conference held in granada in 1998 to the last one held in almería in 2022 the society has promoted the holding on a biannual basis of fourteen consecutive editions all of them included plenary conferences given by spanish and foreign researchers of recognized international prestige the xiv sepex conference at the university of almería has featured 125 oral communications including 9 thematic sessions 113 written communications posters one emerging researcher award lecture given by dr garikoitz lerma usabiaga basque center on cognition brain and language and three plenary talks the pio tudela lecture given by professor nuria sebastián universitat pompeu fabra barcelona and the keynote lectures given by professor kimberly noble columbia university new york usa and professor michael anderson university of cambridge uk this xiv meeting has also included a special symposium to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the foundation of sepex in this symposium 7 of the founding researchers have illustrated their beginnings in the field of psychological research a good reflection of the conditions in which research was carried out in our country at that time through the presentation of their experimental work they tried to explain the questions of interest in their respective fields of study the resources and equipment they had at their disposal and the various vicissitudes that usually accompanied research work at that time you can find further information about sepex in websepex.com
