chapter grover baldwin surveys the quantitative strategy this can be described as using statistics to analyze data and the relationship between variables finally patricia first considers the policy studies perspective which uses multiple methods to analyze options and to provide comprehensive information to decision makers in their efforts to improve legal and educational policies contains 67 references rkj
